



FAQ on the 2026 Fee Structure

As part of our ongoing commitment to supporting our families, we are pleased to provide further clarity on the new fixed fee structure that will take effect in 2026. This change has been carefully designed with the wellbeing of our parents and guardians in mind, with the goal of making school costs more transparent, predictable, and manageable.

Below are answers to some of the most frequently asked questions:

1. Why is the school introducing a new fee structure?

The new structure has been introduced to make school fees simpler, clearer, and easier to plan for. By bringing most of the additional charges together into one single fee, families can budget with confidence and avoid unexpected costs during the year.

2. What fees are included in the fixed structure?

The majority of items that were previously billed separately will now be included in the school fee. This will cover, for example, excursion costs, the school magazine, IEB fees, and other similar charges — giving you greater convenience.

3. What is not included in the fixed fee?

The only items not included will be tours, sports tours, aftercare and subject-specific tours, as these are optional and vary from student to student.

4. What happens to the development levy?

The development levy will remain unchanged in 2026. This contribution continues to play a key role in improving our school's facilities and environment. Over time, as our development projects are completed, the levy will be gradually phased out.

5. Will the fixed fee increase the overall cost of schooling?

The purpose of this change is not to increase costs but to provide better value and peace of mind. By consolidating fees, families will enjoy greater clarity, with fewer separate invoices and a more predictable structure.

6. How will this benefit parents and guardians?


- Simplicity – one consolidated fee instead of multiple charges.
- Transparency – clear understanding of what is covered in the school fee.
- Better budgeting – easier planning of school-related expenses, with fewer surprises.
- Fairness – ensuring consistency for all families through one structured approach.


7. Why do we charge over 10 months on Grade 12 and Grade 7?

Grade 12 and Grade 7 are important transition years. To ensure a smooth conclusion to your child's time at the school (or potential transition), we require that all fees are kept up to date before the year ends. This helps us close accounts fairly and efficiently.
